Parasha tidbits from the Rabbi

"....and he shall take up the ashes which the fire has consumed...." The Kohen is commanded to remove all the ashes from the altar, which result from the sacrifices of the previous day, in order to eliminate any remaining traces. This is because, after a sinner brings his sacrifice to atone for his misdeeds and repents fully (chazar b'teshuvah), there should be no trace left to remind him of his sins. Thus, the memory of his transgressions is completely erased. May we all merit G-d's mercies for the mitzvot we perform, and may we be worthy to celebrate Pesach with our loved ones in happiness and peace. May we see the final redemption unfold in this very month of Nisan.

Parasha thought from Rabbi Arthur Kirsch

In Parshas Vayikra, we learn about all the korbanos (sacrifices) and the process of bringing them. In Parshas Tzav, we have the manual for the Kohanim, detailing what they must do. Yet, in Tzav, there is one korban not mentioned in Vayikra: the korban Todah. Rashi explains that you bring a Todah for a "Nes" (miracle) that has been performed for you. In those days, if you took a long voyage at sea, crossed a "midbar" (desert), were released from prison, or recovered from an illness, you would bring a Todah. But why is this mentioned in Parshas Tzav? The answer is that the Kohanim look at this and ask: What kind of "nes" is this? We experience "Nisim Geluyim" (open miracles) every day in the Beis HaMikdash. The flies never went onto a korban, the smoke went straight up to heaven, and fire came down from heaven. The answer is that this is a "nes shel teva" (a miracle within nature), which is also considered a miracle. The purpose is to remind the Kohanim and everyone else to be aware of this. We thank Hashem every day by saying Modim. Many Gedolim would stand for a long time during Shemoneh Esrei because they thanked Hashem even for the small things. We should remember that Hashem is with us every minute of every day, and we should always be aware of His presence.
