#### Parasha tidbits from the Rabbi

"וְיָהִי הַמַּקְרֶיב בַּיָּוֹם הָרִאשָׁוֹן בֶּן־עֵמִינֵדֶב לְמֵמֵה יְהּוּדָה" (Bamidbar 7:12) "And he that presented his offering the first day was Nachshon the son of Aminadav of the tribe of Judah" We take note that all of the other Nesi'im (tribal leaders) were referred to with the title "prince," while Nachshon was mentioned only by name, without any title. This was done intentionally, so as not to create a sense of arrogance or superiority, as he was the first to bring the offerings. In addition, the Gematria of the words "ביום הראשון" is 620, which is also the numerical value of מתר מלכות (Keter – "crown"). It is fitting, then, that on this day, the tribe of Judah brought its offering—since, as we know, the תר מלכות (Keter Malchut – the Crown of Royalty) was given to the tribe of Judah. May we all be worthy of this crown—always striving to follow in the ways of the Torah.

#### Parasha thought from Rabbi Arthur Kirsch

In Parshas Naso, we read about the *Nazir*, who takes a vow to abstain from wine, avoid becoming *tamei* (ritually impure) through contact with the dead, and refrain from cutting his hair for 30 days. At the end of this period, he must bring several *korbanos*, including a *chatas* (sin offering). What was his sin? According to the Gemara, his sin was that he deprived himself of wine—something that is normally permissible. However, the Ramban offers a different perspective. He says the Nazir's mistake was that he *ended* his Nazirus. While the Ramban cannot argue with the Gemara, his interpretation adds depth. The Ramban is saying that the Nazir became a different kind of person—he reached a much higher *madrega* (spiritual level). But at the end of the 30 days, he chose to return to his previous state. That, says the Ramban, is his sin. He is compared to a *Kohen Gadol* (High Priest), yet after his Nazirus, he reverts back to being just "Mr. Nobody." This is the Ramban's message: When you elevate yourself and reach a new *madrega*—stay there! Don't fall back. Hold on to the growth you've achieved. Have a great Shabbos.
