- **Mechirat Chametz** - Rabbi Haber will be available every day after davening starting this Thursday March 19.
- **Ma'ot Chitim** – A long-standing tradition in Jewish communities is to conduct a campaign for *Ma'ot Chitim* (Shulchan Aruch 429:1) Though it literally means "money for wheat," it refers to helping ensure that every family has what they need to celebrate a kosher and freilach Pesach.

Parasha tidbits from the Rabbi

“הִנֵּה אֲנִי שֹׁלֵחַ לְכֶם אֶת אֵלֶיהָ הַנְּבִיא לִפְנֵי בּוֹא יוֹם הַהַגְדוֹל וְהַנּוֹרָא” (Malachi 3:23 – Haftarah Shabbat HaGadol) “Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and awesome day of Hashem.” One of the reasons Shabbat HaGadol acquired its name is from this very pasuk. The very first Shabbat HaGadol took place in Egypt on the 10th of Nisan—exactly as it occurs this year—five days before the Exodus from Egypt. On that day, בְּנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל were given their first commandment. The Midrash Rabbah (Shemot Rabbah 15:12) states: “When the Jewish people set aside their Korban Pesach on that Shabbat, the firstborn Egyptians gathered near them and asked why they were doing so.” The Jewish people responded: “This is a Pesach offering to Hashem, Who will strike the firstborn of Egypt.” The Egyptian firstborn then went to their fathers and to פָּרְעֹה to request that they allow the Jews to go free—but they refused. The firstborn then waged war against them, and many were killed. This is the meaning of the pasuk: “לְמַכָּה מִצְרַיִם בְּבְכוֹרֵיהֶם — כִּי לְעוֹלָם חֲסִדוֹ” (Tehillim 136:10) “Who struck Egypt through its firstborn, for His kindness is eternal.” We, too, are witnessing the Almighty’s kindness and love for His people in these very days, in our own time. May we merit to see the final redemption speedily in our days. אָמֵן.
