Parasha tidbits from the Rabbi

"וֹיָבֹאֹ אַבְרָהֶּם לְּסְפְּד לְשָׂרָה וְלְבְכֹתָה" (Beresheet 23:2) "...and Avraham came to mourn for Sarah and to weep for her."

The Midrash asks: Where did he come from? From Mount Moriah, he came. This was the essence of Avraham's eulogy — that even though he had taken his son Yitzchak to Mount Moriah for the binding (the Akeidah), Sarah, his mother, expressed no objection. She gave her full consent, out of her deep love and devotion to Hashem. So too, she raised her only son to be ready to give up his life for Hashem — and to do so with joy. This is the true pride of a Jewish mother. יְנִיּאַכְלָּוּ וַיִּשְׁתֹּוֹ הָוֹא (Beresheet 24:54) "And they ate and drank, he and the men who were with him." We learn here of Avraham's powerful influence upon those who worked for him. Eliezer and the men who accompanied him ate only from the food that Eliezer had brought with him — kosher food — for they did not wish to partake of the food prepared by Lavan. To this very day, we take pride in this legacy — that the laws of kashrut continue to be faithfully observed by righteous Jews throughout the world.

Parasha Thought from Rabbi Arthur Kirsch z"l

Eliezer asks the *Ribono Shel Olam* to "do *chesed im adoni Avraham*" — kindness with my master Avraham. The *Ba'al HaTurim* (1269–1340, Germany–Spain) writes that the final letters of the phrase "**im adoni Avraham**" — *mem, yud, mem* — spell the word **mayim** (water). Avraham gave water to the angels (*melachim*), and then, if you look carefully at the letters of *chesed im adoni Avraham*, you will find that they also form the word **damim** (blood). This alludes to the *Akeidah* — the Binding of Yitzchak. At first glance, it might seem as though the *Akeidah* is treated almost as an afterthought in this context. Which, then, was greater — the *Akeidah* or the giving of water? The answer is that the *Akeidah* was indeed greater, as it created **zechuyot** (merits). However, the act of giving water is described as **zechér** — a remembrance. The giving of water represents *chesed* — an act of kindness *bein adam lechavero* (between one person and another). The *Akeidah*, on the other hand, is an act *bein adam laMakom* (between man and Hashem). Therefore, when one seeks Hashem's kindness or favor, it is even more powerful to perform an act of *chesed bein adam lechavero* — kindness between people. Do a *chesed* for someone — and Hashem will "owe you one."
